Mrs Bonds Village Nursery Fees and Payment Policy

This policy outlines our fees and our payment terms

Fees

Nursery fees are as follows:

Early Start 8am - 9am: £5

Session 9am-12pm or 1pm-4pm: £13

Full day 9am - 4pm: £31 Full day 8am - 4pm: £36

These are subject change and parents will be given at much notice as possible before any fee increases.

Invoices

Invoices are sent out termly, before the beginning of the term. Invoices are broken down into weekly payments

Payment

Payment must be made online via BACs payment. Payments must be paid at least 1 week in advance, preference is for fees to be paid half termly/termly upfront

Government Funding

We accept all government funding, including

- -2 year funding
- -Universal 3-4 year old funding
- -30 hour funding

When accessing a funding place the only charges will be for hours above the funding hours.

Childcare Vouchers

We accept payment via workplace childcare vouchers and via the governments Tax Free Childcare accounts.

Late Payments and Non Payment

The nursery will try to avoid any situation which would lead to a dispute between the nursery and the parent over the late payment or, in extreme cases, non-payment of fees. If a parent is having trouble with making a payment, we ask them to come to us and we will see how we can assist

A late payment fee of £40 will be added to the late payment amount if not paid within 2 weeks of the fees being due

The parents must understand that non-payment of fees may jeopardise the child's place, including reducing a child hours to just the government funded hours, or total withdrawal of the child place

Notice Period

We require 4 term weeks notice or payment should your child leave the nursery before they are due to go onto Infant school

Other Information

- Fees must still be paid even if children are absent or on holiday.
- If the nursery has to close due to an emergency (such as extreme weather conditions, or heating/power failure) you will still be liable to pay for the sessions as the reason for closing is out of our control.
- Bank Holidays are payable.
